Art Ministry: "A Brush With The Spirit"

Ministry Focus: Our focus is outreach to the community by having church members invite prospects to participate in a communal activity involving painting a picture. We assist other ministries with their projects where art is appropriate. We are also involved with worship painting experiences.

Mission & Vision Statement: "TO SERVE GOD CREATIVELY"

Volunteer Opportunities:

• Helpers to set up tables and chairs and distribute supplies to participants. (This is mostly a one artist ministry and the artist has physical limitations).

Days/Times for Needs:

We usually have art parties on Saturdays, about once every six weeks depending on availability of space, from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. Prep time takes about an hour and cleanup takes another half hour to forty five minutes.

Desires to Expand:

I would like to expand to include retired residential complexes by shuttling people to the church with volunteers.

All supplies are provided freely. We depend on donations to replenish the supplies. (Businesses in town who do art parties charge \$35 to \$55 for similar events.)

Attendance Counters

Ministry Focus: To count attendance each Sunday

Volunteer Opportunities:

• Become a counter and count once every 4-6 weeks

Days/Times for Needs:

Sundays

Building and Facilities Ministry

Ministry Focus: To maintain the building and grounds in the best possible manner so that the facility can fully support all the activities and missions of Eastside.

Volunteer Opportunities:

- Volunteers with building, construction, painting, electrical, plumbing, HVAC and general handyman knowledge and experience can assist the maintenance staff with building and grounds maintenance on an as needed basis.
- The care and upkeep of the lawn and irrigation system is currently performed by volunteers (See Grounds Ministry). Additional volunteers to assist with lawn mowing, irrigation system maintenance, pulling or cutting weeds would be helpful.
- If you are interested in helping with the Building and Facilities Maintenance ministry we will add your name and skill set to the list of volunteers/resources and contact you when a need arises that you could assist with.

Days/Times for Needs:

Days and times vary according to the specific need. For instance, grounds maintenance occurs regularly during the "growing season", but not during the winter months.

Traditional Special Events of the Ministry:

Occasionally a "work day" will be scheduled to tackle a list of specific projects. These happen on an as needed basis.

College & Cadet Ministry

Website of Ministry: The Cadet Ministry has a page on the Eastside church website.

Ministry Focus: Our focus is on fellowship and building connections with the church. In the past our main thrust has been with the Cadets from the USAF Academy, but we are trying to reach out to the other college students in the congregation.

Mission & Vision Statement: "In order to provide a sense of extended family and community, Eastside focuses on the needs of these students and cadets with a special ministry. For cadets, members volunteer to become sponsor families by applying through the USAFA. A sponsor family can offer a "home away from home" for meals, laundry, or just a place to relax. (If an incoming student would like one of our families to request him/her by name, which can also be arranged by contacting Eastside.) Our ministry also offers activities to build friendships between cadets and college students by offering designated classes and regular get-togethers throughout the school year."

Volunteer Opportunities:

- Sponsor cadets for Doolie Day Out in the summer
- Sponsor cadets for the academic year
- Take cadets home for meals and back to the Academy

Days/Times for Needs:

Largest needs are on Sundays and providing transportation to the airport around Holidays

Cross-Cultural Missions Ministry

Cross-Cultural Missions: American Indian Ministry

Ministry Focus: Our focus is on Christian fellowship, unconditional love, and humanitarian support with the Lakota community, functioning with other Christian congregations, and the church. In the past, our main drive has been to work with the youth at Cheyenne River Youth Project (CRYP). Currently, we are working within the Tribal consul and the whole reservation community-reaching out with sustainable ideas and supplies to all ages and poverty levels.

Mission & Vision Statement: In order to maintain a sense of extended family and Christian compassion, Eastside focuses on the immediate humanitarian needs and long term sustainable needs of the reservation community with our special ministry. We travel to the reservation with a collection of requested items to fill at least one 14 foot trailer. Our ministry also offers activities on the reservation, to build friendships between enrolled members and the congregation by offering art classes, labor for the community, and meals to the community and shut-ins, as well as regular giveaways, throughout the year. Right now, we have more questions than answers and as God's instrument-He leads and we will follow.

Volunteer Opportunities:

- Volunteer to be on the AI Team and collect items from the immediate community, schools, family, and friends
- Volunteer to load, unload, and deliver items to the South Dakota community
- Volunteer to go on a trip to feed and support the South Dakota community
- Volunteer to sponsor and create events to raise money for the sustainable business item projects: sewing machines and items for the "Lakota Star Quilts" and the "Greenhouse Project."

Days/Times for Needs:

The largest short term needs are right before school starts and right before cold weather hits the county. We are working on "Sustainable Business Projects" all year round by assisting with selling quilts made by the community.

Desires to Expand:

Please relay any information regarding interest to support from local businesses, families, or people who are genuinely concerned in helping to develop our "Sustainable Programs."

Cross-Cultural Missions: Angola

Ministry Focus: The Angola Mission Team consists of four families who work side by side with a network of 60 indigenous congregations to plant new churches, equip Angolan leaders, conduct Bible studies, and build connections with Angolans and other Christians across the world.

Volunteer Opportunities

- Participate in the "Bibles for Angolans" program
 - Donate \$10 to purchase a Bible for an Angolan Christian. Each donor is paired with an Angolan Christian and they agree to pray for each other. Bibles can cost up to \$50 per Bible in Angola, so this program greatly blesses the recipients and their families.
- Donate money for medical supplies
 - Unfortunately, it is very difficult to bring supplies in. Most supplies must be purchased in Angola.

Cross-Cultural Missions: Ciudad de Angeles

Website of Ministry: www.ciudaddeangeles.org

Ministry Focus: Support the work at the Children's Home in Cozumel, Mexico, through an annual Spring Break mission trip, fundraising for special projects, child sponsorship (Eastside currently has three child sponsor families), and other work as needed.

Approximately fifteen congregations from all over the country support the work of Ciudad in a similar way. Eastside is one of five "anchor congregations" of Ciudad de Angeles, and as such has special responsibilities, and representation on the governing Board of the organization.

Mission & Vision Statement: Ciudad's mission statement reads as follows:

"Ciudad de Angeles provides a safe & healthy environment based on Christian principles for orphaned, abandoned, abused and needy children living in Mexico. The home raises children to become Christian adults who are responsible citizens in their local communities." Eastside's vision and goal is to assist in any way needed to further Ciudad's mission.

Volunteer Opportunities:

- Annual short-term mission trip to the Ciudad campus in Cozumel to assist in the ongoing work there. The trip is family-oriented, with ages 10 and up welcome (children under 18 require special permission forms, etc.).
- Develop ongoing, long-term relationships with the children at Ciudad through regular visits, letters, etc.
- Teaching English, teaching the Bible, work projects on the Ciudad campus, and reaching out to the local Cozumel area through community service projects while there each March.
- Child sponsorship for those able and willing to do so. Sponsorship is somewhat different from the model used by Compassion International and others. See Bari or Mike is you have any questions.

Days/Times for Needs:

Occasional fundraising projects/events for special needs, some having to do with the March mission trip, and some not.

Meetings for the trip begin each year in October, with monthly required meetings for all team members from October to March. Most people do personal fundraising to help pay for the trip.

Traditional Special Events of the Ministry:

We typically participate in any and all events sponsored by the Missions Committee, including Mission Sunday in October, Shop for a Cause in May, etc. We also occasionally have our own separate events when particular needs arise.

Cross-Cultural Missions Ministry: Guatemala

Ministry Focus: Kemmel and Lisa live and work with the indigenous Mayan population. Dr. Lisa provides medical care to surrounding villages through mobile clinics. Kemmel works with and mentors local church leaders. They work in partnership with Health Talents International.

Volunteer Opportunities:

- Donate supplies
 - o Acetaminophen, Excedrin, Ibuprofen
 - o Antacids, Prilosec, Zantac
 - o Anti-fungal creams, Hydrocortisone creams, Moisturizing soaps
 - o Cold medications (no syrups), Benadryl pills, Antihistamines
 - Eye lubricants (no Visine or Red Eye drops)
 - o Reading glasses, Sunglasses
 - o Dental floss, Toothbrushes, Toothpaste (no mouthwash)
 - Gloves (XS and S)

If you would like to donate any of these items, place it behind the mission wall and mark it "Dunham."

- Sponsor a child through the ABC Child Sponsorship program for \$30/month

- Go on the Guatemala Mission Trip
 - Every odd year towards the end of July, a team of around 15-20 people go down to Chichicastenango for a week to serve the churches in the area and uplift the Dunhams. Each trip also consists of service projects and/or VBS activities.

Cross-Cultural Missions: Tlaquepaque, Mexico

Ministry Focus: We have supported Jose and Sofia for over 25 years. Jose preaches at the local church and conducts one-on-one Bible studies. Jose is gifted with a passion for developing relationships and encouraging the people he studies with into spiritual maturity. Jose often joins the team in Cozumel to build relationships with Eastside members. Jose and Sofia have two children: Trevor and Nelly.

Cross-Cultural Missions: Zambia

Ministry Focus: The Namwianga Mission was founding in Kalomo, Zambia in 1920 with the purpose of teaching the Bible and sharing the gospel. Later, an orphanage, The Haven, was founded. They currently care for 100 infants and toddlers. In addition, Namwianga houses 9 basic schools, 2 high schools, George Benson Christian College, a vocational center, a home for street boys, a radio station, a health clinic/hospital, a Christian Leadership Development Program, and an Evangelism and Spiritual Growth Program.

Mission & Vision Statement: "To reveal Jesus through education, humanitarian service, and Christian leadership."

Prison Ministry

Ministry Focus: Work with Prison Fellowship Ministry (the prison ministry founded by Chuck Colson) to transform men and women from worldly, broken people to disciples of Jesus Christ. The Prison Fellowship Transformational Ministry (TM) program works in cooperation with the Colorado Department of Corrections to introduce inmates to Christianity and to provide coursework to work through addiction, anger management, etc. and to build strong character as men who reflect the image of God. To the CDOC, it is a secular program of "recidivism reduction." To God, it is recapturing lost souls to make disciples of Christ out of the ashes of badly broken lives.

Mission & Vision Statement: Minister to prisoners to give them eternal hope through Christ, thereby transforming them from self-centered and destructive people to compassionate men and women of God.

Volunteer Opportunities:

- Teachers: Teach basic Christianity and various curriculum topics for Transformational Ministry.
- In-Prison Mentors: Work one-on-one with a TM inmate to address personal spiritual and emotional issues through Bible study and counseling skills developed through life experiences and one's growth in Christ.
- After Care Ministry: Serve paroled TM graduates in the local community
 - Mentoring (if parolee does not have an established mentor)
 - Transportation and job-hunt counseling for parolee needing help finding employment
 - Church life Help TM graduate to assimilate into the Body of Christ at Eastside. (This may be a temporary "bridge church" relationship, as parolees may determine that they would fit better with a smaller church, or a church with a different worship format.)

Days/Times for Needs:

- Teachers commit to teaching in Canon City one night per week (two hours, 5:30 pm to 7:30 pm) for the duration of a class (typically 8 weeks; addiction recovery class runs for 24 weeks). Teachers can sign up for multiple classes and be busy through the entire year. However, teachers with limited availability can sign up to teach as little as one class per year. Saturday classes (Saturday 8:00 am to 10:00 am) can be taught on a rotation basis throughout the year.
- Mentors commit to spending two hours per week (Saturday 8:00 am to 10:00 am) one-on-one with a TM student.
- After Care volunteers will work out their own timing to support a parolee returning to Colorado Springs, and recruit church members to provide additional

support, including introducing the parolee to people, connecting him with a small group, etc.

This is a year-round ministry, with brief breaks between classes and from one TM class to the next, although teachers with limited availability can sign up to teach as little as one 8 week class per year.
